Professional experience

- ▶ **Competitive Alternatives International Business Cost Comparisons**—On behalf of KPMG, acted as a project manager for the 2004 *Competitive Alternatives* business cost comparison study. Extensive research was undertaken for over 121 cities in North America, Europe, Japan and Australia to analyse the relative costs of doing business. Data collection included labour, transportation, telecommunication and energy costs and detailed tax rates. Following this study, assisted national and regional development agencies with incorporating other jurisdictions into the study.
- ▶ **Business and Financial Planning: University/Olympics Sports Complex** — Assisted with a strategic review for this organization, including extensive consultation with stakeholders and benchmarking of programs, facilities and organizational structure relative to other leading universities. Developed a comprehensive strategic and financial plan (over 200 pages) for the organization. The comprehensive business plan included an \$800 million sports complex, which will host a portion of the 2010 Olympics Games to be held in Vancouver.
- ▶ **Business Planning: University of British Columbia** — Assisted with the review of several departments for this public university, including the campus and community development department, the health and safety departments and child care services. Activities included extensive stakeholder consultations, program research and benchmarking.
- ▶ **Competitiveness Analysis for North American Automotive Investments** — Participated in a study which examined Canada's competitive position relative to US jurisdictions, by analyzing key factors in automotive investment decisions and comparing Canada to leading US states with respect to those factors. The study compared two Canadian and six US jurisdictions, and focussed on several factors typically considered by companies when deciding on a new plant, including business costs, labour environment, and business environment factors.

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- ▶ **Personal Taxation and Cost of Living Analysis: Canadian Economic Development Agency**—Completed an annual comparison for 2002-2004 of personal taxation and costs of living among a group of Canadian and US cities. The comparisons were focused on high technology employees, to better understand the cost implications of higher salaries being paid to high technology employees in the United States.
- ▶ **Competitive Alternatives International Business Cost Comparisons**—On behalf of KPMG, acted as a lead researcher and analyst for the 2002 *Competitive Alternatives* business cost comparison study. Extensive research was undertaken for over 60 cities in Canada, the United States and Japan to analyse the relative costs of doing business. - ▶ **Program review for Department of Fisheries and Oceans, Habitat Restoration and Salmonid Enhancement Program**—Conducted a review of a five-year fisheries program established for British Columbia and the Yukon. The review involved site visits and interviews with several participants throughout the region. This information was to provide guidance to the department for the future of community-based delivery of fisheries projects.
- ▶ **Program evaluation for Fisheries Renewal BC's Salmonid Renewal Program**—Led a program evaluation and audit for FsRBC involving 10 partnership groups delivering this program during the 1999-2000 fiscal year. The evaluation and audit involved site visits and interviews with administrative representatives and Board members, and focused on the administrative and technical delivery of the program.
- ▶ **Workloads study and survey of faculty and teaching staff at BCIT**—Assisted with the preparation of a survey and report which analyzed the workload implications of the unique features of delivering polytechnic education in BC. The study involved an internal and external data review, interviews with senior BCIT faculty members, and extensive data analysis of an on-line workloads survey.
- ▶ **Industry Targeting: Canadian Regional Economic Development Agency**—Assisted a regional development agency in identifying high-growth industries within the marine sector which may be suitable for relocation or expansion to region. Information was developed on competing locations and key firms in each identified industry, as well as specific locational requirements of each industry.
